Some great and largely clean racing was on show in Cumbria. Litchfield and Michael Simpson dominated KF1 and KF2 respectively, whilst in KF3 Carl Stirling just managed to hold Russell Danzey off in final one, but slipped to third in the second final behind Danzey and Jake Dennis. Roy Johnson and Brett Wykes had a great dice in Cadets, but Wykes was excluded from the meeting for an engine out of tolerance.

B4/Renault Elf MSA British Kart Championship for KF1

Qualifying: Litchfield (45.43),Nicholas Yelloly, Jordon Lennox-Lamb.

Heat 1: Litchfield, Lennox-Lamb, Lee Bell.

Litchfield, Heat 2: Jonathan Walker, Lennox-Lamb.

Final 1: Litchfield dominated, with a total clean sweep. Although Walker led for a short while, Litchfield was soon into his stride to take a 1s margin over the line from Walker, with Chris Rogers a further 2s in arrears.

Results Final 1: Litchfield, Walker, Rogers, Richard Bradley, Yelloly.

Final 2: This one was slightly closer, and this time it was Bradley who got the better of Rogers for third, but some 4s down the road from second placed Walker. Lennox-Lamb was close Litchfield's pace in the heats but seemed to take too much out of his tyres and had to settle for two seventh places in the finals.

Results Final 2: Litchfield, Walker, Bradley, Rogers, Elliott Burton.

Heat 3: Norris, Lewis Hall, Patryk Szczerbinski.

Heat 4: Balmer, Danzey, Taylor. Repechage: Max Robinson, Ashley Sutton, Lynn, Sam Blake. Final 1: Taylor and Balmer earned the front row positions whilst Lynn's heat exclusion forced him to come through the repechage. Eventually Stirling came to the fore in the race, from sixth on the grid, after a terrific duel with Danzey, Taylor and Dennis right behind. Balmer had to be content with sixth, behind Alex Walker.

Results Final 1: Stirling, Danzey, Taylor, Dennis, Walker.

Final 2: Danzey found that Dennis was his main rival, as they fought hard for supremacy along with Stirling. The three karts flashed over the line separated by only two tenths of a second. Albon's first final reed failure had lost him a finish, forcing him to start the second in 29th place, beginning a remarkable recovery to fourth, setting fastest lap on the way, and only 0.7s down on the winner.
