Cadet champion Roy Johnson chose not to race, whilst for Mark Litchfield it was business as usual, with what might have been two wins but for a tap in the second final, Jordon Lennox-Lamb penalised elevating Lee Bell. Rob Foster-Jones rose to the challenge with two KF2 wins, whilst in KF3 Carl Stirling sealed his British title in the first final, Patryk Szczerbinski taking his first win in the second. Qualifying: Bell (41.01), Litchfield, Lennox-Lamb.

Heat 1: Litchfield (pic opposite), Sam Tordoff, Lennox-Lamb.

Heat 2: Litchfield, Chris Rogers, Denis Gorman.

Final 1: Litchfield and Rogers went out ahead, with one brief trade of the lead, thereafter Litchfield leaving no gaps. Lennox-Lamb towed Richard Bradley past Bell.

Results Final 1: Litchfield, Rogers, Lennox-Lamb, Bradley, Bell.

Final 2: Litchfield's initial lead was first challenged by Bell, then Lennox-Lamb took up the front position for several laps. But Litchfield fought back to the front, only to be pushed wide by Lennox-Lamb on the last lap, dropping the champion to third. A four place penalty then elevated a lonely running Rogers to the podium.

Final 1: Stirling sliced under Szczerbinski at Park, and despite one brief role reversal mid-race, clung onto the lead of a seven kart train until the flag. Sutton pounced on Szczerbinski for second in a very tight 1-2-3 finish. Results Final 1: Stirling, Sutton, Szczerbinski, Albon, Mackenzie

Final 2: Stirling fell to fourth within a couple of laps, but fought back past Sam Snell to find Szczerbinski and Sutton a second down the road. Szczerbinski enjoyed his first KF3 win in what would be his last junior race.

With the loan of the CIK data loggers to check for excessive clutch slip in the KF classes, KF3 drivers Russell Danzey and Alex Walker, and KF2 driver Craig Stirling were excluded from the meeting after timed qualifying. The KF3 drivers appealed the penalty but it was not upheld. Sam Jenkins (KF3) was excluded for the same reason after a heat. S1 organisers have promised to amend the 2009 regulations so that the penalty only applies to the race or TQ, not to the event.

Alex Lynn was excluded from TQ when his inlet box was found not to be airtight. Mark Litchfield was fined £500 for his in-lap retaliation on Jordon Lennox-Lamb.
