Lucas Orrock took the first Max 177 final, and the record showed Harry Cockill winning the second. but only after David Griffiths getaway was interrupted by a broken chain just before the flag.

Nathan Harrison, MiniMax Final 1: Harrison bolted clear until reigned in by Scott for a flurry of lead changes before Harrison cleverly let Scott through at the first hairpin only to get it back at the second. Final 2: Battle recommenced between Scott and Harrison, but

after Harrison had just re-taken the lead with Rob Holland following, a red flag countback awarded an overwhelmed Scott the win.

Roundups

TKM Rnd 3 @ Larkhall

Oliver Hodgson steadily extended his leading margin to seven seconds for another Junior TKM victory, whilst in Extreme Charlie Bruce-White backed Ryan Cole into the pack. Cole dropped back in the last corner action. In senior 4-stroke Michael West came out tops in a duel with Michael Rich. Luke Rosewell fell out of the junior 4-stroke lead in favour of Miles Murphy. Honda Cadet poleman Daniel Ticktum was nerfed out of the lead, leaving Jamie Caroline to win after besting the later excluded Jack Mitchell.

MSA Rnd 2 @ Shenington

In the first KF1 final, Ben Cooper came out on top of a hard fight with Jonathan Walker. Come the second, Mark Litchfield finally found form, but was pushed off the track whilst fighting for the lead, then Cooper squeezed past Rob Foster-Jones for the win. Jake Dennis enjoyed a double KF3 win, benefiting from a tangle behind in the first final, then finding a chink in Jake Dalton's defence is the second.

Jordan Chamberlain and Shaun Carter had the legs on the rest in the first KF2 final, and finished in the same order come the second, except Chamberlain was further ahead. Harry Woodhead hung on for the first Cadet win over TJ Nelson. In the second final, Woodhead seemed content to sit behind Nelson, pulling them clear of the rest. On the last lap, Nelson left the door open in the chicane, giving Woodhead his second win.

MSA Rnd 3 @ Rowrah

Mark Litchfield is finally back on form with two dominant KF1 wins, Lee Bell the best of the rest in the first final after Richard Bradley punctured. Despite a heavy heat crash with Jordon Lennox-Lamb, Ben Cooper came through to second in the grand final, Luke Wright third in both. Jake Dennis and Alexander Albon took a win and second apiece in KF3, Sennan Fielding losing a wheel just after being passed by Jordan King for third. No-one could mount a

challenge serious to Jordan Chamberlain in KF2. Josh Fielding the nearest in Final One, and Shaun Carter behind him in the second final, as Chris Lock came up for the final podium spot. Two classic Cadet finals with no easy predictions had Max Vaughan winning the first and Sam Vanderpump the second. Ricky Collard bravely fought back to fifth after a precautionary hospital visit on Saturday.
